Every school-aged child in America has the nourishment needed to learn and grow. As a leader in the movement to end childhood hunger, Blessings strives to ensure children don't go hungry on the weekends by empowering individuals and communities to take action.

Mission

Blessings in a Backpack mobilizes communities, individuals, and resources to provide food on the weekends for elementary school children across America who might otherwise go hungry.

Geographic Coverage

- Serving children in 45 U.S. States and Washington, D.C.
- Not operating in: Hawaii, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oklahoma, Utah

Backpack Basics

- Average five volunteers per program location
- Typical menu: Six to eight items with a focus on protein and nutrient rich foods. Most items are USDA approved for use in school feeding programs, meaning low sugars and high fibers.
- To provide one hunger-free weekend to a child, the average cost is \$2.90.
- As little as \$110 gives a child a school-year full of hunger-free weekends (38 weeks).

Need

- More than 13 million American children live in food insecure homes.

- When school dismisses on Fridays, more than 13 million children will leave their classroom, uncertain whether they will have enough food to eat that weekend.

General Talking Points

Most people can't wait for the weekend. Kids at risk of hunger can't wait for it to be over.

Did you know 13 million kids in America won't have enough food to eat this weekend? That's one in five kids who will eat meals at school during the week but is without access to affordable, nutritious food on Saturday and Sunday. The consequences are much more than a growling stomach. Hunger can cause many physical health problems. It can also shorten a child's attention span, lower their IQ, and keep them from making good grades.

To ensure the kids in your community have full bellies over the weekend, Blessings in a Backpack sends them home on Fridays with backpacks full of satisfying and nutritional food. Who will feed the kids this weekend?

- As a leader in the movement to end childhood hunger, Blessings strives to ensure children don't go hungry on the weekends by empowering individuals and communities to take action.
- Blessings in a Backpack provides weekend nutrition for elementary school children across America who may otherwise have little or no food to eat on weekends during the school year.
- Each Friday of the school year, thousands of volunteers across the country at more than 1,000 program locations are sending home a bag of food with children who face hunger that weekend.
- During the current school year, more than 90,000 children facing food insecurity will receive more than 3.2 million hunger-free weekends from Blessings and our dedicated volunteers.
